He has played critical roles in founding a number of local civic and volunteer organizations including Edison Tree Fund, Save The Oak Tree Pond, Edison Greenways Group, where he spearheaded the creation of the Middlesex Greenway rail-trail, and was President of the Edison Wetlands Association when it purchased the Triple C Ranch, the last farm in Edison.

Furthermore, he works with the Edison Eagle Scouts along with local volunteer, community and youth organizations on Environmental, Open Space and Historical projects, initiatives and activities. Moreover, he has been an active participant in the development of Edison's Master Plan, Smart Growth Plan and Open Space strategic planning and project efforts since 1998. Current Chairman of the Edison Open Space Advisory Committee, he also serves on ten other local/regional boards and committees.
