EMPOWERING THE NEXTGENERATION! Lockheed Martin has been the exemplary corporation promoting financial literacy and business education in schools throughout Burlington and Camden Counties by encouraging youth to become fiscally responsible. For over five years, Lockheed has offered its staff as classroom volunteers for academic enrichment programs such as Junior Achievement (JA), a non-profit that inspires kids to succeed in a global economy through the conduits of financial literacy, work-readiness, and entrepreneurship.

The Lockheed Martin classroom volunteers have raised over \$50,000 to enable the Junior League to provide financial literacy programs for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade in schools throughout Burlington and Camden counties. For five weeks, these professionals volunteer to facilitate weekly classroom sessions.

These influential mentors help participating southern New Jersey schools raise the bar in teaching relevant life concepts of budgeting and decision-making. Over the past two years, 55 volunteers have taught 35 K-12 classes at Catto and F.X. McGraw Schools in Camden, Baker School in Moorestown, Somerdale Park School, James Johnson School in Cherry Hill, and Delran High School, reaching over 640 students.
